Loving our neighbors by working for energy equity

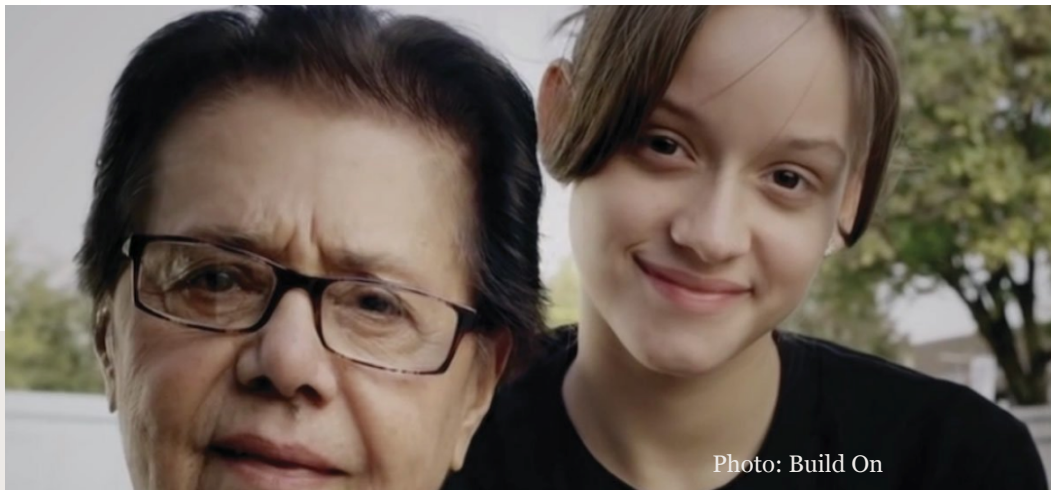
